Wilson County resident James K. “Ken” Davis appointed to RTA Board

NASHVILLE – James K. “Ken” Davis has been appointed by Governor Phil Bredesen to serve on the board of directors of the Regional Transportation Authority (RTA).

He replaces Roger Farley, whose term expired. Davis will serve a five-year term on the RTA Board, which is comprised of city and county mayors and community leaders in a nine-county area in the greater Nashville region. He is part of a group of 31 people to serve on the board whose members provide oversight and leadership to the RTA.

“I welcome Ken Davis to the RTA Board. As a representative of Wilson County, his perspective and input will be valuable as the board works to offer a variety of transportation services throughout the Middle Tennessee region,” said Rogers Anderson, RTA Board Chairman and Mayor of Williamson County.

Davis is a lifelong resident of Wilson County, where he graduated from high school in Watertown. Following a 37-and-a-half year career at BellSouth, he retired in 2007 and opened a small lawn care business. Since 1991, he has served on the Board of Directors of the Wilson County Emergency 911 and is currently the Vice-Chairman.

In addition, Davis serves on the Board of Directors of Wilson County Christmas for All that helps to provide Christmas for over 2000 children in the Wilson County area. He is a Master Mason at Lodge 98 in Lebanon and a member of Lebanon First United Methodist Church. He and wife Glenda have two daughters.

The RTA is an agency supported by member communities in a nine county region. Created in 1988, RTA offers Middle Tennesseans transportation solutions. The mission of RTA is to offer the citizens of Middle Tennessee choices and alternatives on how they commute to work each day and to coordinate local regional transportation services. By maximizing federal, state, and local funds with fares, RTA provides and/or manages regional commuter bus service, hundreds of vanpools and carpools, and Tennessee’s first modern day regional rail service, the RTA Music City Star.
